The Henry County Audit Committee, consisting of Steve Greer, Chairman, Melanie Dodd, Vice Chairman, Tom Beasley, Kenneth Humphreys, and Bobby Milam is pleased to make the following report to the Henry County Commission.

Our committee met on April 9, 2018, to review the Comptroller's Annual Financial Report for Henry County, Tennessee for the year ended June 30th, 2017. A copy of the minutes of said meeting are attached to this report.

We reviewed in detail PART II, FINDINGS RELATED TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS. We have attached a copy of the audit finding 2017-001 given to the Director of Schools, the County Mayor's Office and General Fund and the Solid Waste Fund. Each fund was cited for Expenditures EXCEEDED APPROPRIATIONS. In the case of the General Fund, wheel tax collections exceeded budgeted revenue by \$6,950. Because this was a pass through to the Highway Fund, the transfer exceeded the original budgeted amount of \$460,000. The Mayor and Director of Finance responded to the Division of Audit with their corrective action and the committee concurs with their response.

The Solid Waste Fund revenue collection exceeded original amounts which lead to the expenditure for trustee collections be exceeded. Our committee concurs with the corrective action proposed by the Mayor and Director of Finance.

The finding on the General School Fund was addressed by the Director of Schools and the School Director of Finance. The plan of action for correcting this was concurred with by our committee.

We acknowledge that the County Mayor made our committee aware of the opportunity to for a representative of the Division of Audit that is preparing the

audit to meet with the committee or individual members to answer any questions with regard to the audit.

Being no further business to report, the Audit Committee respectfully presents this report to the Henry County Commission for its approval.

Section 5-9-401, Tennessee Code Annotated, states that "All funds from whatever source derived, including, but not limited to taxes, county aid funds, federal funds, and fines, that are to be used in the operation and respective programs of the various departments. commissions, institutions, boards, offices and agencies of county governments shall be appropriated to such use by the county legislative bodies." This deficiency exists because management failed to hold spending to the limit authorized by the county commission, which resulted in unauthorized expenditures.

RECOMMENDATION

Expenditures should be held within appropriations approved by the county commission.

We concur with this finding and have taken the necessary steps to prevent this finding in the future.

Accounting literature describes a best practice as a recommended policy, procedure, or technique that aids management in improving financial performance. Historically, a best practice has consistently shown superior results over conventional methods.

The Division of Local Government Audit strongly believes that the item noted below is a best practice that should be adopted by the governing body as a means of significantly improving accountability and the quality of services provided to the citizens of Henry County.

HENRY COUNTY SHOULD ADOPT A CENTRAL SYSTEM OF ACCOUNTING, BUDGETING, AND PURCHASING

Henry County does not have a central system of accounting, budgeting, and purchasing. Sound business practices dictate that establishing a central system would significantly improve internal controls over the accounting, budgeting, and purchasing processes. The absence of a central system of accounting, budgeting, and purchasing has been a management decision by the county commission resulting in decentralization and some duplication of effort. We recommend the adoption of the County Financial Management System of 1981 or a private act, which would provide for a central system of accounting, budgeting, and purchasing covering all county departments.




