- ITEM NO. 2 The invocation was led by Commissioner Travis.
- ITEM NO. 3 The pledge to the flag was led by Commissioner Visser.

#### ITEM NO. 4 Roll Call

The following Commissioners were present: Jerry Berry, Wesley Bradley, Dell Carter, Greg Carter, James Copeland, Randy Gean, Kenneth Humphreys, Don Jones, Kreg Kyle, Paul Neal, Monte Starks, James Travis, Marty Visser, David Webb, and Drew Williams.

#### ITEM NO. 5 Citizen's Forum

- Sally Peterson from W.G. Rhea Library thanked the commission for funds given last year. It enabled the library to better serve Henry County and Paris.
- Kathy Collins, Director of the W.G. Rhea Library, thanked the commissioners for their support and handed out goodie bags to each of them.
- Christy Casey spoke in support of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment Resolution.
- David Hayes addressed the commission regarding the artificial turf for the football field at HCHS. He has spoken with Coach Counce about this issue, and they have agreed to disagree. Mr. Hayes feels, from a taxpayers standpoint, there are better ways for the money to be used.
- Joe Kissick spoke in support of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment Resolution.
- Kyle Graves, HCHS band director, voiced his support of the artificial turf. He stated it will benefit many, including the band.
- Mike Weatherford talked about the "buy local" motto. He asked if having a local company fix the drainage issues on the football field had been addressed, rather than spending the money for artificial turf.
- Bobby Milam asked the commissioners if they had talked to their constituents and asked their opinion on the artificial turf issue. He urged each of them to vote based on their constituents' answers and to vote their conscience.

#### THE CHAIR CLOSED THE FORUM

#### ITEM NO. 6 Commissioner's Forum

- Chairman Greer addressed the commission, stating the decision was already made by the school board to approve the artificial turf. He said the decision to change minds of the school board should have happened when the school board previously met prior to tonight's meeting. Greer said it's not the job of the commission to make that decision tonight. Greer stated "Tonight, all the commission is voting on is whether to move money from the line item "Assigned for Capital" to the line item "Capital Turf Project."
- Director of Schools Leah Watkins stated that it was so great to see people so passionate about the school system. She talked about the deteriorating status of the football field for some time now. She stated the artificial turf could serve multiple sports; not just football and band.
- Commissioner Gean expressed appreciation for the 1<sup>st</sup> District. He has spoken to many regarding the issue and will vote based on his constituents' wishes.
- Commissioner Starks expressed that he has spoken with many from the 3<sup>rd</sup> District and he will be voting based on their recommendations.
- Commissioner Visser showed appreciation for the large crowd attending the meeting. He advised people to come to commission meetings and get to know their commissioners.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HENRY COUNTY, TENNESSEE TO ENTER INTO AN INTER-LO-CAL LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN CALLOWAY COUNTY, KENTUCKY SHERIFF'S DEPT. AND HENRY COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, this agreement is made and entered into as of this the 18th day of February, 2020 by and between CALLOWAY COUNTY Sheriff's Dept. (hereinafter referred to as "CALLOWAY Sheriff's Dept.) and HENRY COUNTY, TN (hereinafter referred to as "County") for use of equipment located at: Woods Tower- 7475 Rabbit Creek Rd, Buchanan, TN and equipment located at Puryear City Hall, 110/112 N. Sycamore St., Puryear, TN 38251.

WHEREAS, Calloway Sheriff's Dept. desires to use equipment owned and operated by the County for the purpose of installing, operating and maintaining two way radio repeaters for improvement of the Calloway County Sheriffs Dept Radio Network; and

WHEREAS, Henry County Emergency Management has a separate License Agreement with the City of Puryear for use of premises, likewise, Calloway County Sheriff's Dept. will be required to obtain written permission from the City of Puryear for installation of any equipment on property located at 112 N. Sycamore St, Puryear, TN.

WHEREAS, the County is willing to permit a license for the said use of the County equipment subject to certain conditions,

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the execution of this Inter-Local License Agreement, it is mutually agreed between the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. LICENSE: County hereby gives permission, subject to the terms of this agreement, to the Calloway Sheriff's Dept. to install equipment at the Licensed Premises for the purpose of installing, operating and maintaining radio repeaters and equipment for the improvements of the Calloway County KY Sheriffs Dept Radio Network, (the "Improvements"). It will be required to obtain written permission from the City of Puryear for installation of any equipment on property located at 112 N. Sycamore St, Puryear, TN.
- **2. PREMISES:** Woods Tower- 7475 Rabbit Creek Rd, Buchanan, TN 38222, 110/112 N. Sycamore St, Puryear, TN 38251(36 26.685N –88 20.026 W)
- 3. USE OF LICENSED PREMISES: Calloway Sheriff's Dept. shall be permitted to use the County equipment for the operation of the Improvements for a subscriber (number of radios used) fee assessed per year. This fee will be based on the Henry County Public Safety Interoperability Radio System subscriber user fee schedule. The fee may be subject to change due to system maintenance needs over time. Calloway Sheriff's Dept. shall not be permitted to use the Licensed Equipment for any other purpose or agency except by prior written permission of the County. Calloway

County Sheriff's Dept. will not be held liable for any other system maintenance charges as long as subscriber fees are kept current when invoiced.

- **4. TERM:** The term of the License is for twenty (20) years, from March 16, 2020 through March 16, 2040. At the end of this term, a new updated agreement may be necessary and agreeable to both parties.
- 5. ACCESS: The County shall provide Calloway County Sheriff's Dept. access to the County Premises through County authorized personnel. Integrated Communications, Inc is the County's radio maintenance vendor, and ICI will be only vendor allowed for installation of Calloway County Sheriff's Dept. equipment into County equipment racks per specifications.
- 6. MAINTENANCE: The costs of any installation, maintenance and operation of the Improvements are the sole responsibility of Calloway Sheriff's Dept. It is the responsibility of the County to maintain all other aspects and maintain utilities ongoing. The City of Puryear may charge separate fees to Calloway County Sheriff's Dept. outside of this license agreement for which the County will have no liability.
- 7. LIABILITY: The County acknowledges and agrees that any rights or claims against the County or its employees hereunder, and any remedies arising therefrom, shall be subject to and limited to those rights and remedies, if any, available under Tennessee Code Annotated, Sections 9-8-101 through 9-8-407. Any claim alleging personal injury or property damage resulting from the negligence of the County, its employees or officials, shall be filed with the Claims Commission of the District of Tennessee for disposition in accordance with state law or insurance liability carrier. Damages recoverable against the HWD shall be expressly limited to claims paid by the Commission or insurance liability carrier.
  - 8. INSURANCE: Calloway Sheriff's Dept. shall maintain adequate public liability insurance, which may include self-insurance, and provide satisfactory evidence of such protection to the County with monetary limits of the Licensee's insurance not less than the monetary limits of liability provided by the Tennessee Governmental Tort Liability Act, T.C.A. § 29-20-101 et seq., as it may be from time to time amended. Any successors and assigns agree to maintain public liability insurance with the limits of said insurance to be no less than the exposure and limits of the County's liability under the Tennessee Claims Commission Act, T.C.A. § 9-8-301 et seq., as it may be from time to time amended and/or construed by the Claims Commission and the courts, and will provide satisfactory evidence of such protection to the City. The Calloway Sheriff's Dept. agrees that these indemnification provisions shall run with the land/facilities and that Calloway County Sheriff's Dept. shall not assign its rights hereunder unless it obtains the prior written consent of the County and the assignee of the assignment agrees to the indemnification obligations contained herein. Any equipment owned and operated by Calloway County Sheriff's Dept. should have separate insurance for protection of owned equipment. The County will not be held liable for any equipment owned and operated by Calloway County Sheriff's Dept.

- **9. PERMITS:** Calloway County Sheriff's Dept. is responsible for obtaining and paying the costs of all installation, permits, licenses or other approvals by any regulatory body having jurisdiction over the uses authorized herein.
- **10. ASSIGNMENT:** This license shall not be transferred, conveyed or assigned to another party without prior written approval from the County.



Dear Mayor Greer,

I am writing to request the County of Henry County Tennessee give Calloway County KY E911 formal permission to utilize Henry County property located at 7475 Rabbit Creek Rd. Buchanan, TN 38222 and also the water tower in Puryear TN. I have asked the Mayor of Puryear to bring the subject of the water tower to their City Council for consideration.

Our use would include installing equipment for a new Calloway County Public Safety Radio Communications Network. The County of Calloway County KY and Henry County 911 would be partnering to implement this project for improved radio communications coverage for Calloway County emergency response service agencies for increased first responder safety, dispatcher contact, and improved response times for calls for service. The Puryear Police Dept, the Henry County Sheriff's Dept and the Calloway County Sheriff's Office would be the main benefactors of these sites use. These two sites will be part of a multi antenna site, county wide system which when finished will allow for much needed radio communications for the Calloway County Sheriff's office and increase interoperability between not just two counties but two states.

Henry County Emergency Management has already installed an antenna mount tripod system at the top of the water tank with coax brackets down to the ground. Puryear City Hall houses the transmitting equipment. The E911 of Calloway County KY wants to add a microwave dish to the railing of the water tower and a repeater to the system. It is my understanding the City of Puryear would be willing to offer the use of the property. E911 of Calloway County KY would be more than willing to help with the electricity costs associated with the radio equipment that is installed on the Puryear water tower. The E911 of Calloway County KY wants to add a repeater to the Woods tower located on Rabbit Creek Rd. We would also be willing to pay \$30.00 per year per radio that we put on the system.

I am providing an inter-local agreement for Henry County TN to sign for a formal agreement between the two parties. If you have any questions, please contact Major Nicky Knight, Calloway County Sheriff's Office at 270-753-3151
