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



SECTION 2. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that all fee officials enumerated in Section 8-22-101 T.C.A., shall pay over to the Trustee all fees and commissions collected each month. All such fees and commissions shall be placed in the County General Fund as provided by Section 8-22-104, T.C.A.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriation made by this Resolution which covers the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of, but not in addition to, said statutory appropriations. The salary, wages, or renumeration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County, shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this Resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other renumeration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division, or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division, or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit of the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division, or department ending June 30, 2025. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the fiscal year in which the expenditure is to be made to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Sections 9-11-101 to 9-11-119, inclusive, T.C.A.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certain school funds which function as clearing accounts have been included in the revenue and appropriation for the year ending June 30, 2025, as a memorandum only. It is expressly understood that the County Board of Education may not create or incur expenditures from these funds above actual revenue of such funds. It is further directed that no transfers may be affected between these clearing accounts and the operating school funds accounts.

SECTION 6. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 have been collected, not exceeding 60 percent of the appropriations of individual funds. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements to the fund for which the loan is made and the loan shall be paid out of revenue of the fund for which

money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the authority of Title 9, Chapter 21, T.C.A. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2026.

SECTION 7. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2024 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2026 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year ending June, 2026. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse and be of no further effect at the end of fiscal year as of June 30, 2025.

SECTION 9. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that; whereas, Section 5-932, T.C.A., authorizes the Board of Commissioners of Henry County, Tennessee, to make appropriations to non-profit, charitable organizations; and, whereas, the said Board of Commissioners of Henry County, Tennessee, recognizes the various non-profit charitable organizations located in and around Henry County have great need of funds to carry on their non-profit, charitable work:

<u>Section a.</u> The sum of Thirty-five Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$35,200) be appropriated to the Volunteer Fire Departments to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

<u>Section b.</u> The sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) be appropriated to Aspell Recovery Center.

Section c. The sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) be appropriated to Buddy Ball.

Section d. The sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) be appropriated to Civil Air Patrol.

Section e. The sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) be appropriated to St. John's/Community Developmental Services to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section f. The sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) be appropriated to Habitat for Humanity.

Section g. The sum One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) be appropriated to Henry CASA.

<u>Section h.</u> The sum of Five Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$5,250) be appropriated to the Fair Association to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section i. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) be appropriated to Henry County Youth Baseball to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section j. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) be appropriated to Kentucky Lake ASA Softball to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section k. The sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) be appropriated to Mary's Kids.

Section 1. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) be appropriated to Paris Academy for the Arts to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section m. The sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500) be appropriated to Paris Downtown Boxing.

Section n. The sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) be appropriated to Paris-Henry County Arts Council to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section o. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) be appropriated to the Heritage Center to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section p. The sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) be appropriated to the Paris-Henry County Chamber Music Society.

Section q. The sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) be appropriated to the Paris-HC Rescue Squad to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section r. The sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) be appropriated to the Star Center.

<u>Section s.</u> The sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) be appropriated to Tennessee College of Applied Technology to benefit the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.

Section t. The sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500) be appropriated to Carl Perkins Center.

<u>Section u.</u> The sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500) be appropriated to West Tennessee Hearing & Speech.

Section v. The sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) be appropriated to Wo/Men's Resource and Rape Assistance Program (W.R.A.P.).

<u>Section w.</u> The sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) be appropriated to Training/Transition Advocacy Referral Peer Program (T.A.R.P.).

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all appropriations enumerated in Section 9 above are made subject to the following conditions:

1. That the non-profit charitable organization to which funds are appropriated shall file with the County Clerk and the disbursing official a copy of an annual report of its business affairs and transactions and the proposed use of the County's funds in accordance with rules promulgated by the Comptroller of the Treasury, Chapter 0380-2-7. Such annual report shall be prepared and certified by the chief financial officer of such non-profit organization in accordance with Section 5-932(c), T.C.A.

- That said funds must only be used by the named non-profit charitable organization in furtherance of its non-profit charitable purposes benefiting the general welfare of the residents of Henry County.
- 3. That it is the expressed interest of the Board of County Commissioners of Henry County, Tennessee in providing these funds to the above named nonprofit charitable organizations to be fully in compliance with Chapter 0380-2-7 of the Rules of the Comptroller of the Treasury, and Section 5-932 of the T.C.A. and any and all other laws which may apply to county appropriations to non-profit organizations and so this appropriation is made subject to compliance with any and all of these laws and regulations.

SECTION 11. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision in this Resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2025.

SECTION 13. BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that a true copy of this Resolution be spread upon the Commission record of this date.

# INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF PARIS AND HENRY COUNTY REGARDING W.G. RHEA PUBLIC LIBRARY

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of July 1, 2025 ("Effective Date"), by and among the City of Paris, a municipal corporation located in Henry County, Tennessee ("City") and Henry County, Tennessee ("County").

WHEREAS, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 10-3-101, et seq., since April 1959, the parties have cooperated to provide a public library to the citizens of Henry County and The City of Paris;

WHEREAS, such public library has operated as the W.G Rhea Public Library under the direction and operational control of a Board of Trustees comprised of individuals appointed to that Board by the parties;

WHEREAS, the parties desire to continue to support and maintain the W.G. Rhea Public Library;

WHEREAS, the parties desire to clarify their mutual responsibilities with regard to the W.G. Rhea Public Library and the appointment of members to the W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees;

WHEREAS, the parties hereto possess the authority to enter into this agreement pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 12-9-101 et seq., and Tenn. Code Ann. § 5-1-113, respectively;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

#### 1. TERM

a. This Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2025, and continue from fiscal year to fiscal year until modified in writing by both of the parties, or terminated by either of the parties.

#### 2. W.G. RHEA PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees shall be comprised of nine (9) persons appointed as follows:

- a. The City of Paris shall appoint four (4) persons to the W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees;
- b. Henry County shall appoint five (5) persons to the W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees;
- c. The term of each person appointed to the W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees shall be three (3) years;
- d. A person appointed to the W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees may be immediately re-appointed to a second three-year term;
- e. Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 10-3-103(b)(2), no person may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms as a member of the W.G. Rhea Library Board of Trustees;

f. Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 10-3-103(b)(2), a person who has served two (2) consecutive terms as a member of the W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees may be reappointed to that Board after a minimum three-year break in service.

### 3. FUNDING

- a. The parties agree that the W.G. Rhea Public Library shall be funded by the parties equally at 50% pursuant to an annually acceptable amount as agreed by both parties and consistent with the Tennessee Code as it relates to maintenance of effort.
- b. The W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees, in addition to submitting annual statements of operation, shall submit its final proposed fiscal year annual operating budget to the City of Paris and, separately, Henry County, each year at least three (3) months prior to the adoption of budgets by each of the parties.
- c. Neither the City of Paris or Henry County shall be obligated for any expense of the W.G. Rhea Public Library other than their respective equal shares of the annual operating budget agreed by both parties.
- d. The W.G. Rhea Public Library Board of Trustees is authorized to seek funding from other sources, public and/or private, as that Board deems appropriate to facilitate the mission of the W.G. Rhea Public Library.

#### 3. MISCELLANEOUS

- a. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements, whether written or oral.
- b. Any amendments or modifications must be in writing and signed by all parties.
- c. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Tennessee.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 5-7-25**

## A RESOLUTION OF THE HENRY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO APPROVE THE LEVY OF AN ADDITIONAL COUNTY-WIDE MOTOR VEHICLE TAX

WHEREAS, T.C.A. § 5-8-102 authorizes counties to levy a motor vehicle privilege tax, or "wheel tax", as a condition precedent to the operation of a motor vehicle within the county; and

WHEREAS, under a prior resolution of this Board of Commissioners, there is also a motor vehicle privilege tax of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) plus Administration fee of fifty cents (.50) for a total of fifteen dollars and fifty cents (\$15.50) assessed in Henry County, which tax will continue unless and until repealed by this Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the need for new revenue sources to fund construction, capital improvements, repairs, and maintenance is great in Henry County; and

WHEREAS, the Henry County Board of Commissioners has determined that it is in the best interests of the county that an additional motor vehicle privilege tax in the amount of thirty dollars (\$30.00) be levied in Henry County as provided herein, with the exemption of Motor Cycles, Class I Vehicles, Class II Vehicles, Low Speed Vehicles, and Medium Speed Vehicles, and the amount of said tax on these vehicles will be fifteen dollars (\$15.00), so that the total motor vehicle privilege tax in Henry County will be forty-five dollars and fifty cents (\$45.50) for each motor-driven vehicle and thirty dollars and fifty cents (\$30.50) for each Motor Cycles, Class I Vehicles, Class II Vehicles, Low Speed Vehicles, and Medium Speed Vehicles, after June 30, 2026.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Commission that the tax imposed by this resolution be repealed upon completion of the following described projects and the satisfaction of any associated indebtedness: (a) construction of new county services building; (b) renovation of County building located at 311 East Wood Street, Paris; (c) renovation of County building located at 1108 Tyson Avenue, Paris and (d) restoration of courthouse bell tower and belfry;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by this Board of Commissioners of Henry County meeting in regular session at Paris, Henry County, Tennessee, on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of July 2025, that:

SECTION 1. For the privilege of using the public roads and highways in Henry County, Tennessee, there is levied upon motor-driven vehicles, and upon the privilege of the operation thereof, except farm tractors, self-propelled farm machines not usually used for operation upon public highways or roads, and motor-driven vehicles owned by any governmental agency or governmental instrumentality, and except for other exemptions provided by general law, a special privilege tax for the benefit of such county, which tax shall be in the amount of forty five dollars and fifty cents (\$45.50) for each such motor-driven vehicle, and thirty dollars and fifty cents (\$30.50) for each Motor Cycles, Class I Vehicles, Class II Vehicles, Low Speed Vehicles, and Medium Speed Vehicles, the owner of which resides within said county. This tax applies to, is a levy upon, and shall be paid on each motor-driven vehicle, the owner of which resides within said county. This tax shall be in addition to all other motor vehicle privilege taxes now levied in Henry County.

SECTION 2. The tax herein levied shall be paid to and collected by the County Clerk of Henry County, who is authorized by T.C.A. § 67-4-103 to collect such privilege taxes. The County Clerk shall collect this tax at the same time he or she collects the state privilege tax levied upon the operation of a motor-driven vehicle over the public highways of this state, and all other county motor vehicle privilege taxes levied in Henry County. The County Clerk shall deduct a fee of five percent (5%), or such higher or lower fee as may from time to time be authorized

under T.C.A. § 8-21-701 for receiving and paying over county revenue, from the amount of taxes collect and paid over to the County Trustee.

SECTION 3. Payment of the privilege tax imposed hereunder shall be evidenced by a receipt issued by the County Clerk, the original of which shall be kept by the owner of the motor-driven vehicle to evidence payment of all other motor vehicle privilege taxes levied in Henry County (a decal or emblem shall not be required).

SECTION 4. The privilege tax or wheel tax herein levied, when paid, together with full, complete and explicit performance of and compliance with all provisions of this resolution by the owner, and payment of all other motor vehicle privilege taxes levied in Henry County, shall entitle the owner of the motor-driven vehicle for which said tax was paid to operate or allow to be operated his vehicle over the streets, roads and highways of the county for a period of one (1) year which will run concurrently with the period established by T.C.A. § 55-4-104 for state registration fees. In the event a wheel tax charged by the Clerk for a period of more or less than a twelve-month period, the tax imposed shall be proportionate to the annual tax fixed for the vehicle and modified in no other manner, except that the proportional tax shall be rounded off to the nearest quarter of a dollar.

SECTION 5. The motor vehicle privilege tax herein levied shall begin July 1, 2026, and continue unless and until repealed by this Board of Commissioners.

SECTION 6. The proceeds of the motor vehicle privilege tax herein levied shall be placed in the county general fund and shall be used for construction, and capital improvements, to (a) construction of new county services building; (b) renovation of County building located at 311 East Wood Street, Paris; (c) renovation of County building located at 1108 Tyson Avenue, Paris and (d) restoration of courthouse bell tower and belfry;

SECTION 7. If any provision of this resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to that end the provisions of this resolution are declared to be severable.

SECTION 8. This resolution shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body of Henry County at two (2) consecutive regularly scheduled meetings.

SECTION 9. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon being approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body of Henry County at two (2) consecutive regularly scheduled meetings. For the purpose of collection of the tax herein levied, such collection shall begin on the first day of July, 2026.

# AGREEMENT FOR AGRICULTURAL AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS HENRY COUNTY AIRPORT

This Agreement is entered into by and between **Henry County Airport** ("Airport") and the agricultural aircraft operator identified above, including its pilots and ground crew ("Operator"), for the use of the airport facilities in support of agricultural aviation operations.

### **PURPOSE**

This Agreement sets forth the terms and minimum standards for the conduct of agricultural aircraft operations at the Airport and establishes cost-recovery fees related to facility maintenance and contamination prevention measures regularly required as a result of such operations.

### FEE STRUCTURE

To offset documented expenses incurred by the Airport in connection with the cleanup and remediation of agricultural residues and related operational impacts, the Operator agrees to pay the following fees:

- 1. Additional Cleanup Fee: \$200.00 per occurrence where the Operator fails to properly clean up residues, spills, or debris attributable to its operations.
- Major Damage Fee: Additional fees may be assessed in the event of significant property damage or contamination requiring specialized remediation.

These fees are not aircraft landing or takeoff fees and are not based on the frequency or volume of aircraft movements. They are intended solely to recover costs associated with facility maintenance necessitated by agricultural aircraft activities, in compliance with FAA guidance regarding airport revenue use and fee assessments.

# MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR AGRICULTURAL OPERATIONS

- Spill Containment: Operators must maintain an EPA-approved containment kit and rinse supplies capable of responding to fuel, oil, coolant, or chemical leaks. All spills must be promptly and thoroughly remediated by the Operator.
- Chemical Handling: Aircraft servicing and chemical transfer operations must be conducted with appropriate safeguards to prevent spillage, airborne drift, or contamination of airport property, including runways and adjacent operational areas.
- 3. **Designated Loading Area**: All loading and unloading of chemicals, fertilizers, seeds, or other agricultural materials must take place only at the south end tie-down area, near the grass opposite the hangars.
- 4. Post-Operation Cleanup: No visible residues, debris, or chemical traces may be left on the ramp or surrounding areas. Failure to clean the affected area will result in the imposition of the Additional Cleanup Fee described above and potential assessment for damages.
- 5. Fuel Handling Safety: Each fuel transport vehicle must be equipped with (i) at least one 20 lb. BC-rated fire extinguisher, and (ii) grounding/bonding cables.
- 6. Licensing and Insurance: Operators must provide:
  - o A valid Aerial Applicator License for each pilot; and
  - Proof of liability insurance in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence, which must include coverage for environmental contamination and cleanup resulting from operational accidents or mishaps.

# SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND GENERAL RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS RELATING TO COMPENSATION FOR HOURS WORKED

This Settlement Agreement and General Release of Claims Relating to MCLYNN'S Compensation for Hours Worked throughout the course of her employment by HENRY COUNTY is willingly and voluntarily entered into by Candace Danielle McLynn (hereinafter "MCLYNN") and Henry County, Tennessee, (hereinafter "HENRY COUNTY").

MCLYNN and HENRY COUNTY are entering into this Agreement because they mutually desire to have an orderly and complete settlement of any and all claims that MCLYNN has relating to her compensation for any hours worked throughout the course of her employment by HENRY COUNTY that resulted in her filing a lawsuit in the United States District Court for the Western District of Tennessee styled Candace Danielle McLynn v. Henry County, Tennessee, U.S. District Court No. 1:25-CV-01051. In consideration of their mutual promises and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

### Section 1. Definitions:

a. As used in this Agreement, the term HENRY COUNTY means HENRY COUNTY, TENNESSEE. The term HENRY COUNTY also means any and all successors, assigns, agents, representatives, insurers, members of HENRY COUNTY and employees of HENRY COUNTY.

b. As used in this Agreement, MCLYNN means Candace Danielle MCLYNN, herself, who resides in the State of Tennessee, and her attorneys, heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns.

Section 2. MCLYNN'S Agreements. In exchange for MCLYNN's promises
contained in this Agreement, HENRY COUNTY will pay to her ATTORNEY, Michael
Weinman, within 21 days of the approval of the settlement by the Henry County
Commission, the amount of MCLYNN and her attorney hereby
acknowledge receipt of the total sum of and hereby remise,
release, and forever discharge HENRY COUNTY of and from any and every claim,
demand, right or cause of action, of whatsoever kind or nature, by reason of HENRY
COUNTY'S failure to properly compensate McLynn for any time that she worked while
under the employ of HENRY COUNTY. MCLYNN further acknowledges that this sum of
is made payable as set forth above to her and her
attorneys on behalf of HENRY COUNTY.

Section 3. HENRY COUNTY'S Agreements. In exchange for MCLYNN's promise to dismiss with prejudice her lawsuit against HENRY COUNTY in the matter styled as Candace Danielle McLynn v. Henry County, Tennessee, U.S. District Court No. 1:25-CV01051., and her promise not to file any other lawsuit against HENRY COUNTY based upon the alleged failure to properly compensate MCLYNN for any hours worked while employed by HENRY COUNTY, and in consideration for MCLYNN'S agreement to execute this Settlement Agreement and General Release of Claims Relating to

Compensation Worked while employed by HENRY COUNTY (hereinafter "Agreement"), HENRY COUNTY agrees to the payment of the settlement amount referenced above. HENRY COUNTY further agrees that if any HENRY COUNTY officials or employees are contacted by any future prospective employers for Plaintiff, that Plaintiff will be given a neutral reference limited to the positions she held while working for HENRY COUNTY and the beginning and ending dates of her employment.

MCLYNN recognizes that HENRY COUNTY is not withholding any income tax, F.I.C.A., or any other type of payroll deduction from the gross settlement amount paid to MCLYNN or her attorneys under this Agreement, and that F.I.C.A. contributions are not being made by HENRY COUNTY on said payment. By so agreeing, MCLYNN and HENRY COUNTY do not intend to indicate that such withholdings and contributions were required or appropriate. MCLYNN agrees to be responsible for all taxes due on all sums received by her and she acknowledges her obligation to provide the information about this settlement to her tax preparer, so that the settlement funds will be treated properly for income tax reporting purposes. MCLYNN represents and warrants that she will not seek to have this obligation discharged in the event that she should elect to file any form of bankruptcy petition.

### Section 4. MCLYNN's Agreements

MCLYNN represents and warrants that no person other than herself is entitled to assert any claims of any kind against HENRY COUNTY as a result of MCLYNN's employment relationship with HENRY COUNTY and the alleged failure of HENRY COUNTY to properly compensate her;

Section 5. MCLYNN agrees that she will not make any statements, or take any actions whatsoever, to disparage, defame, or compromise the goodwill, name, or reputation of HENRY COUNTY or any of its employees.

Section 6. No Admission. HENRY COUNTY denies that it has acted wrongfully with respect to MCLYNN, and HENRY COUNTY specifically disclaims any such liability to MCLYNN. Further, HENRY COUNTY's entering into this Agreement shall in no way be construed as an admission. Further, the payment of the settlement proceeds are also in consideration for MCLYNN's releasing the claims for injuries or damages that she has alleged, or is alleging as to any alleged underpayment or other undercompensation of her by HENRY COUNTY.

Section 7. Attorneys' Fees and Costs. As further mutual consideration of the promises set forth herein, MCLYNN and HENRY COUNTY agree that there is no prevailing party in this action and that they are each responsible for their own attorneys' fees and costs. Each agrees that they will not seek from the other reimbursement for attorneys' fees and/or costs incurred in this action or relating to any matters addressed in this Agreement, except for a breach of this Agreement. However, HENRY COUNTY agrees to pay for the entire mediator's fee in this action including MCLYNN's portion of the mediation. The total amount of the mediator's fee in this action is \$2,880.00.

Section 8. Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains all of the terms, promises, representations, and understandings between the parties and shall bind and inure to the benefit of MCLYNN and HENRY COUNTY, and their respective successors, heirs, and

legal representatives. This Agreement may not be amended, modified, or changed orally, but only by agreement in writing and signed by the parties.

Section 9. Severability. Should any section or portion of this Agreement be held unreasonable and unenforceable by any court of competent and final jurisdiction, such decision of the court shall apply only to the specific section or portion involved and shall not invalidate the remaining sections or portion of this Agreement.

Section 10. Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Tennessee.

Having read this Agreement, MCLYNN agrees that she is entering into this Agreement knowingly and voluntarily and that no promises, representations, or inducements not expressly set forth in this Agreement were made to her which caused her to sign this Agreement. MCLYNN FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES THAT SHE HAS READ AND FULLY UNDERSTANDS THE MEANING AND INTENT OF ALL OF THE PROVISIONS AND TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING THE FINAL BINDING EFFECT OF HER WAIVER OF RIGHTS UNDER SECTION 4 ABOVE.
